GENEROUS DONATION BY OW IN LONDON

We have been delighted and encouraged to receive £5000 donation from an Old Westerfordian currently retired in London. He ensured that all taxes and charges involved both in the UK and on our side were covered by him, so the full amount has been credited to our account.

He has been inspired by the foundation of Claremont High School and Westerford's vital and ongoing role in this new state school. Accordingly, he requested that the gift be shared fifty-fifty between the two schools.

Murray Gibbon (also an OW) is the Principal at CHS, and has responded warmly to this significant and heartwarming gesture.

The donation was formalised at the London OW reunion last year. Each school has benefited to the tune of R43 457. At Westerford, we are investing the donation in a wonderful photographic display, which is to be part of the new Diamond Jubilee Wing (opened on 23 September).

Claremont High School are holding onto the donation until next year, when they will be (hopefully) acquiring more land. See Murray Gibbon's letter in this newsletter.

It is believed that this is the largest single donation ever made by a past pupil to Westerford. It is his second such donation, and we are deeply appreciative of his warm, generous and practical support, and his endorsement of all for which Westerford stands.

HCA hosts Lara Foot- Newton on Thursday 18 September

This Thursday HCA hosted esteemed playwright, Lara Foot—Newton, CEO of the Baxter Theatre, writer of numerous South African plays (most notably *Tshepang* and *Karoo Moose*), director of many others and winner of dozens of awards. She came to speak about her experiences as a playwright in South Africa.

Inspired by the play *Born in the RSA*, she acquired a love for drama as a teenager and started to question the status quo of South African politics. Her career has spanned the height of apartheid to the modern day but her style of focusing on South African issues has remained constant. *Tshepang* is one of her most famous and controversial pieces. It is based on the horrific gang rape of a nine-month-old baby in 2001 (the play recently incited more controversy last year when the Matric drama paper asked pupils to describe how to portray the rape scene). Her daughter was only a few months old at the time and the incident had such a profound effect on her that she chose to base the play on it. Lara Foot-Newton spoke passionately about her experiences and her enthusiasm was almost palpable. To both those interested in her take on politics and those interested in drama, she was an inspirational speaker.


